## **Constant Attendance Allowance Factsheet**

If you are awarded Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit (IIDB) as a result of your diagnosis of mesothelioma, you will be asked if you want to apply for Constant Attendance Allowance (CAA). Your care needs are required to be significant in order to be awarded CAA.

#### The amount of benefit

CAA is paid at one of the following rates, depending on the level of care required:

- Part time
- Normal maximum
- Intermediate rate
- Exceptional rate

#### **Exceptionally Severe Disablement Benefit**

This benefit is considered automatically if you qualify for CAA at either the intermediate or exceptional rates and the amount of care required is likely to be permanent.

#### Will an award of CAA affect my other benefits?

If you receive disability living allowance(DLA) care component, personal independence payment (PIP) daily living component or attendance allowance (AA) then this benefit will be reduced by the amount of CAA you receive. However, if you are awarded CAA at one of the two higher rates it will act as a top-up to DLA/PIP/AA. An award of CAA will not affect means tested benefits such as Universal Credit, Pension Credit, Housing Benefit etc.

#### Can I have savings and other income?

You can have any amount of savings, income or earnings and still qualify for CAA and Exceptionally Severe Disablement Allowance.

### Can I apply for CAA at a later date?

If you feel that you do not qualify for CAA straight away, retain the CAA application form which will be sent out with your IIDB award notice. If your care needs change over time then you can apply for CAA at a later date.
