A MUM of two is among a group of ten women who have bravely bared all for a charity calendar.

Linda Wren, 54, of Springvale, Iwade, organised a photo shoot and production of 500 calendars in memory of brother-in-law Simon, from Rainham, who died in March at the age of 48 from Mesothelioma, a rare form of cancer.

As in the box office hit film *Calendar Girls*, the women are photographed in all their glory to raise money for charity Mesothelioma UK.

Miss January is Anne Livermore, barmaid at the Woolpack pub, Iwade, kicking back by the fire with a copy of the *East Kent Gazette* added: "We've raised about £1,700 so far, and it would be brilliant if we could reach £3,500.
