## Choosing the Right Solicitor

Anyone wishing to pursue a claim for Mesothelioma (or any other asbestos related disease) should seek advice from a specialist firm of solicitors. Choosing the right firm may be the most important factor in determining whether or not a claim is successful and, if it is, the speed in which it is settled and the amount of compensation obtained. An appropriate firm of solicitors will be one which:-

- Has the right experience and expertise
- Will deliver the right level of service, sensitively given the physical and emotional burden of being diagnosed with mesothelioma and
- Will deal with the claim at no cost

Not all solicitors have the specialist knowledge or expertise. Avoid using Claims Management Companies and instead instruct a specialist firm.

Your Lung Cancer Nurse Specialist may be able to provide you with examples of solicitors who have expertise in dealing with this type of claim. In both instances the firms are independent and will give impartial and confidential advice. They will provide initial advice and pursue claims at no cost. You are free to choose another solicitor. You may wish to speak to a number of different firms of solicitors before making a decision.

Not all Lung Cancer Nurse Specialists have contact details for solicitors but if provided, the solicitors' details given are from firms known to have knowledge and experience of mesothelioma claims. There is no guarantee they will be successful but they have a reputation for their expertise in this area and have all provided Mesothelioma Nurses Action Team (MNAT) with information about the cases they have been involved with.

Alternatively, you might be given contact details for an Asbestos Victims Support Group who provides information about solicitors known to have knowledge and experience of mesothelioma claims.

Trade union members (and individuals who were members of a trade union at the time they were exposed to asbestos, but who are no longer members of a union) may be entitled to union legal services, which may also be free to them. Trade union legal support may also be available for claims made by the families of trade union members.



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If you have no history working with asbestos you will have difficulty pursuing a claim unless you have a solid connection with someone who did. Note: you should contact a solicitor as soon as possible after diagnosis as time limits to your claim may apply.

You are free to choose any firm of solicitors to represent you. When you are making that choice ask the solicitor about their experience in dealing with asbestos cases. Important questions to ask are:

1. How many Mesothelioma cases has the solicitor dealt with?
2. Has the solicitor taken any cases like yours to settlement and if so, how many?
3. How long does it usually take the solicitor to conclude Mesothelioma cases?
4. Does the solicitor have specific knowledge of the employers involved in your claim?
5. Will the solicitor arrange to visit you at your home at a time convenient to you to discuss the claim?
6. Will all medical details of your case be gained from your medical records or will it be necessary for you to have a medical examination?
7. How will you be kept informed of your claim's progress and how often will you be updated?
8. Will the solicitor deal with the claim at no cost to you?
9. Will you receive 100% of the sum of compensation agreed or awarded?
